CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JAPAN STUDY TOUR 2012

This program and each one of you will be representing this nation and a new idea in international education at a very sensitive time in US-Japan relations. We will be, at every moment, closely observed and evaluated by Japanese educators and home-stay families. As a result of this, each one of you will share the responsibility for the success and continuation of the program.

This is why you must agree to abide by this code and each rule **WITHOUT ANY LAPSES**. If you do not comply with the Code of Conduct, you will be returned immediately to the United States at the considerable expense of your parents/guardians. We assume that this will not be necessary.

1. You will abide by the guidelines for luggage, clothing, personal belongings and expenditures.
2. You will not **AT ANY TIME** wonder off, individually or in small groups from the large group, even for a moment, without first getting permission from the teacher.
3. When traveling through the airports and while on the day trips, especially in large crowds, you will remain attentive to the group and its direction. To help keep the groups together (and not lose anyone), we will have standard bearers and small group leaders whose responsibility will be, at any moment, to account for the members in his/her group.
4. When with your home-stay family, you will not go off individually, or even with your host brother or sister, without first getting permission from your host parent. In addition, you will not be out later than 8:00 PM unless accompanied by your house parent.
5. There will be no smoking, drinking or alcoholic beverages, or gum chewing at any time on the trip. Smoking is illegal in Japan for teenagers! Be advised that illegal substances break not only our rules and laws, but the Japanese laws that carry out serious consequences.
6. Teachers and chaperones reserve the right to inspect student baggage if any student is suspected of carrying any times noted in #5, or any items that might jeopardize the safety and integrity of the study tour participants.
7. You will wear appropriate, conservative clothing at all times on the trip.

I have read and understand the Code of Conduct above. I understand that if I do not follow these rules, it may result in returning back to the United States at my parent/guardian expense and consequences upon returning back to school.
